At CHASE BASKETBALL, we strive to give every skills session participant, the opportunity to focus solely on their skills development for the whole duration of the session attended.

CHASE BASKETBALL aims to provide training that offers a positive teaching environment to all students and coaches. In order to foster this philosophy, we have introduced a code of conduct based on the **Green** - **Amber** - **Red** traffic light system.

*Every student starts their weekly training session on **Green**.*

Amber warnings are issued when:

- An athlete intentionally disrupts the normal course of the session
- An athlete is being verbally or physically abusive towards other students
- An athlete is being verbally or physically abusive towards coaches

*Every **Amber warning** received per session (up to 2) will result in 5 min sit-outs per warning and parental notification.*

Reds warnings are issued in the event of:

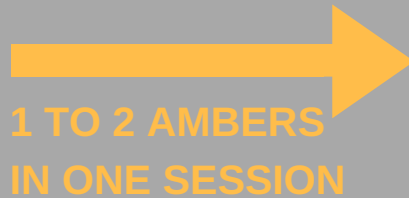
- Aggravated verbal abuse towards a student or a coach
- Aggravated physical violence towards a student or a coach
- 3 Ambers warnings have been received in one session

Every Red warning received will result in a suspension of the student for the following session and parental notification.

Two Red warnings received in a term will result in a suspension of the student for the remainder of the term and parental notification.



Every student starts every session on green



5 min sit-out per amber to cool down and get ready to get back into training mode



3 AMBERS IN ONE SESSION



Student is suspended for the remainder of the term

2 REDS IN THE TERM



Student sits out the rest of the training and is suspended for the next training session
